- twin with another local church, ecumenically or within the Circuit.
- increase its membership 15% by 2026 (and 20% by 2030)
- developing other ministries in response to community needs.
- draw resources from the Streams and the District.

### **Update from Kenneth Holmes**

I am Chair of Trustees of a Christian based Charity, St Andrews House Residential care home. They currently have 9 residential vacancies and would like to offer these first and foremost to those from church backgrounds or affiliations. St Andrew's House, Coventry, is a residential home for older people, aiming to provide a caring environment, whilst also offering choice and independence to support the community of residents to live a constructive, positive, and fulfilling lifestyle. The home has been recently redeveloped to provide extensive,

up to-date facilities and the home can currently accommodate up to thirty-five people in single en-suite rooms. It has one large and two smaller lounges, two modern dining rooms, an activities room, a hair



dressing salon, a dedicated chapel, and extensive gardens. The home

also has a Christian ethos with weekly services available for any residents who would like to attend. COVID vaccinated staff, regular testing, high standard of infection control exercised, COVID free residents since June 2020. Currently the home is offering a limited time offer, 4 weeks for the price of 3! This is for anyone who wants to try out the home before making a commitment or even just wants a little rest and relaxation for a short time.
