1) A word from our Superintendent Hello Church,

Our Love for our neighbours in Ukraine is being tested. God's heart bleeds as it contends with Russia's aggression on the basis of Russia's own motives. How should those motives be the trigger of this brutal war? God's love is further tested when the aggression has led to unplanned separations of one side of families from the other. Love is always affected by the pain of separation.

God's love suffers too. God's love is tested by the departure of families to neighbouring and distant countries while the continued migration of children, the elderly, the disabled, et al, intensifies the pain that God's love suffers. For loving parents to not know where their children are speaks of a slow agony. Outcries of displaced people that God receives, near and far, steps that the war-stricken refugees make into the unknown, increase God's suffering. The voices of the people in distress, crying for justice, continue to echo in God's ears, and the evolving emerging needs of the people further trigger the suffering of God's heart.

We are called to share in and respond to God's suffering for war-stricken people. Prayer is a form of sharing, it's powerful! The offer of hospitality to refugees, a form of response, heals God's hurting heart. Donations of cash and tangible day-to-day goods please our God. I encourage other churches to do likewise. Let's emulate the Macedonian Church who in their poverty showed much generosity. "For they gave according to their means, as I can testify, and beyond their means, of their own accord ... taking part in the relief of the saints – and this, not as we expected, but they gave themselves first to the Lord and then by the will of God to us." (2 Corinthians 8:2-5).

Let's continue to demonstrate our love towards our neighbours in need. The truth is, "love always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres" (1 Corinthians 13:7). Marcus

4) National Express Chaplain (an extract taken from the National Express National Magazine—February 2022)

Currently operating across the West Midlands and having forged a ten year strong relationship with National Express, the team is there to speak about anything; from work worries to broader questions about life and the universe. The service has been especially valuable during the pandemic with chaplains agreeing that, "It's been the most challenging - but most rewarding - time to be a chaplain. Chaplains belong to the Christian church. They want to fulfil the church's mission to contribute to the community but, rather than "sitting in a church waiting for people to come to them, the chaplain goes out where they are needed. People spend a lot of their time at work, so that's where the chaplain goes to support them." Coventry chaplain Clive Fowle says: "Following a tragic incident at my garage, I increased the number of my visits for several weeks, talking to many drivers, canteen colleagues and others in the garage about what had happened. That deepened my relationships with everyone, and I go into the garage far more

The work of a Chaplain is often to signpost people to other services, such as mental health.
