Sermon: Ready for action.

Good preparation can mean the difference between success and failure.

A conscientious person will take time and put a lot of effort into being ready for whatever task is at hand.

Readiness makes the wheels turn better, In a world of schedules, being ready and on time is essential for an efficient and cohesive society. Imagine that you are waiting to welcome guests. What do you need to do? You would need to make sure that your home is clean, comfortable, and welcoming. You would have to stock up on supplies. Not to do so would show disrespect to your guest and a lack of care. In Jesus' parable, he puts an expectation on his servants to be ready for the master until he returns. The good servant continues his duties and does them conscientiously even when the master is absent, and the servant isn't being watched. The bad servant lapses into

laziness and fails his or her master.

This parable is all about an attitude of mind. It speaks to Christians of all times and all ages. It tells us that there will be a day when Jesus, the master, will return and he will expect us to be faithful until that day. Christianity isn't a part time faith. It's a daily, unending life of righteous living. If we say that we have lots of time until Jesus returns and fail in our duties to serve and to love as he loves, then we fall into sin. It would be very easy to do that. The early church believed that Jesus would come back in their own time, and it hasn't happened yet but that doesn't mean that it won't. We are closer today than we have ever been before. It's all in God's hands and remember, **God's time is the best time.** Jesus will come back, we don't know when, but it's promised in scripture. We need to be constantly faithful to God, day in, day out if we want to receive the words 'Well done you good and faithful servant. Amen.
