# This is an excerpt from the EcoDistrict News

This is the first update for 12 months – the delay due to a combination of the intervention of COVID and a decision to hold back publication until the decisions made at COP27 could be included.

The content of this newsletter reflects the rapidly growing concern for the state of the planet and the urgent need for us all to do something about it. This is clear in the messages from Rev'd Novette Headley, our new District Chair, and from Adam Sanders, our District Mission Advisor, both of whom emphasise not only the urgency of the situation, but the need for our churches to become actively involved. The District is planning to focus on the EcoJustice issue at the Spring Synod in April, so please keep a watch out for further information.

Progress on Caring for Creation is slow but steady. The good news is that we now have 21 churches in the District with EcoAwards; the bad news is that almost 100 of our Birmingham churches have yet to actively demonstrate their concern for the stewardship of the planet.

I am reminded of the story of the congregation which made life difficult for a novice monk preaching his first sermon. Asked if they knew what he was going to say, half said they knew; the other half said they didn't. His simple response was 'Let those that know, tell those who don't know' – an appropriate message for those of our churches who are already responding to the environmental crises and who might help to bring other churches on board. # **Kenilworth Methodist Church EcoFayre and Grounds for Hope**

The annual Kenilworth Eco Fayre in October is organised jointly by the town's five Eco Churches. Besides providing visitors with the chance to browse commercial stalls offering sustainable and locally produced merchandise, this event is also a good opportunity to meet the local green community groups.

Grounds for Hope, our new edible garden has now completed its first full growing season. Designed to be readily accessible to passers-by on Priory Road, the garden's wheelchair-friendly path was an instant hit with the primary school children who scooter and cycle to and from school. In June early risers taking the detour though the garden raced to find the strawberries which had ripened overnight. As the weeks went by there were also tiny, sweet petits pois, courgettes, cucumbers, and beans to be found. For some the regular pattern includes naming the veg: "sweetcorn, beans, courgettes, lettuce, peas" while making their way along the path past the raised beds. Grounds for Hope has provided a wealth of opportunity for engaging with local residents. It is amazing how many have taken the time to stop and tell us how much they like what we're doing and very often we then go on to have all sorts of interesting conversations.
