Loving others as God Loves us

1) A word from Helen and Neil Bishop on behalf of Stream 4 Justice, Compassion and Peace—SAVING THE PLANET FROM DISASTER - AN UPDATE ON COP26

At the beginning of November last year, the 26th United Nations' Climate Change Conference (COP26) took place in Glasgow. It was widely billed as the last chance to save the planet from disaster and during the Conference the circuit held an online prayer meeting to pray for the outcome.

Unfortunately, the Conference did not deliver everything that was hoped for. The COP26 President, Alok Sharma, told the closing session, 'We can now say with credibility that we have kept 1.5 degrees alive, (which is the target for limiting global warming to avoid catastrophic climate change). But, its pulse is weak, and it will only survive if we keep our promises and translate commitments into rapid action.'

Most of that rapid action will need to come from governments or organisations. In the run-up to COP26 the Methodist Connexion joined the growing list of Christian churches and charities which have undertaken to divest from, or switch their investments away from, carbon generating industries. We need to make sure that our own local churches and charities do the same. There is also the opportunity to become an eco-church, as Fillongley did recently, with different stages - bronze, silver, and gold - on the way to becoming completely eco-friendly.

There was widespread disappointment that COP26 failed to address the urgency of phasing out fossil fuels, so Friends of

the Earth disputes that COP26 has in fact kept the world on track to avoid a higher rise in global temperatures. Developing countries and environmentalists were also disappointed that once again there was no commitment to compensate for the damage already done by climate change to the poorest people in the world and for the cost to them of divesting from the little bit of carbon they use. The government's decision to reduce rather than increase its support to developing countries sent the wrong signals ahead of COP26.

However, it would be hypocritical to press for governments and other organisations to take more rapid action, and switch more quickly to sustainable investment, if we as a church don't also try to do this ourselves. For example, we have switched our pension funds to a new provider which promises to invest them only in sustainable, carbon neutral or alternative energy industries. You may have taken similar actions you wish to share with the rest of the Circuit. Please, get in touch with us at Stream 4 as we continue to explore together the way to become a completely eco-friendly Circuit

2) Touch of Hope is back in Business!

I have just returned from a visit to Croatia, the first for over two years. I was wondering how much our work is still needed in Croatia, Serbia, and Bosnia. From day 1 my colleagues and I received a resounding YES that we should continue our work of Reconciliation. We conducted a taster workshop just outside Osijek for 13 people for 9 men and 4 women, including 4 from Bosnia. Our plan is to recommence our programme of workshops in September.

Our visit also included reconnecting with former participants who were pleased to see us and who are fully supportive of continuing the work. Our newly trained facilitators will be assisting in leading workshops, and we want to train more facilitators.

As expected, the war in Ukraine is bringing back painful memories of the past war in the former Yugoslavia. Refugees from Ukraine are moving into the Osijek area. There is a possibility of involving them in our own workshops.

On the Sunday I preached in a small evangelical church near

the border with Serbia. The small congregation were very welcoming and produced an enormous lunch after the service which went down very well with me! The village Ilaca is a pilgrimage site for Catholics as the Virgin Mary is alleged to have appeared there in the 19th century. The church sends its greetings to our circuit.

We also attended a book launch for Dragica who came to Nuneaton three years ago. The book is about her and her peace work.

Our work is generously supported by the Fund for World Mission. However, we shall need more money if we want to do all that we plan.

I am happy to come to churches to talk more about this exciting work of reconciliation. I felt the Spirit guiding us all the way on our visit. We need more people to join us on our committee. Thank you.

The shields that had been made especially for Ridge Lane and Mancetter by the Parish Chairman, (107 in total) had been painted by the children and adults with pictures and script illustrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, and these were placed on the lamp posts in the village.

The children were issued with ration books, again by our friends at Mancetter, and these entitled the children to a sweet ration. They didn't mind queueing! Everyone who attended was given a lapel badge which had the event printed on it. The hall had tables groaning with plates of food, plus the tea, coffee and squash kept up with the demand. A gentleman on the Parish Council also produced a card for each year of our Queen's reign with something that had happened then and was displayed on boards inside the church. This was of immense interest to all who came and reminded people of exactly when it happened. As the weather was so kind, we were able to open the garden. The children played with the outside games provided and the parents used the lawn for a picnic tea. The shields will be auctioned by the Parish Chairman and the proceeds will be donated to a charity of his choosing.

Woodside Avenue Methodist Church

Having had a marvellous Pentecost Service with Rev Graham Gee, it was all change for Woodside to host the Woodside Avenue Residents' Street Party. This was intended to be in the church carpark but was largely transferred indoors when the weather proved unpredictable.
