Catch up with our Local Lay Pastor - John Prickett

John Prickett has been working as a voluntary Local Lay Pastor for the circuit and we caught up with him to ask how he has found the role. Here is what he said. Perhaps it will inspire you to offer, or to encourage somebody else to offer. Please speak with your minister if you feel God might be encouraging you in this direction.

Q: Hello John, so how long have you had this role of Local Lay Pastor?

A: About two years now

Q: And how have you found the role?

A: I've really enjoyed the involvement with other churches as well as my own and the building up of friendships by meeting new people and strengthening the bonds of fellowship with people I've already known for a while

Q: Tell us what kind of things you do as a LLP.

A: I've been visiting different people in homes and in hospital, and share extended communion with them. One of the things I really like is that I take preaching appointments regularly each quarter with the same churches and I can stream it towards a group of people I'm getting to know.

Q: Does it feel any different from being the person that you already were?

A: It feels different from being a Local Preacher because now, as the Local Lay Pastor, there's a sense of knowing their situations more closely rather than just calling in now and again as a preacher. I've been learning more about the life of the other churches, and not just what happens on Sunday. I also get some 1-2-1 supervision because I'm working on behalf of the circuit and I appreciate that guidance and help. I feel I have more guidance on what the wider church is doing and the opportunity to get to know people is great.



Q: Does it feel like you represent the church differently?

A: Yes I now feel like I'm more closely linked with the churches I work with and I am representing the circuit when I visit people at home.

Q: Has anything surprised you about the role?

A: It's worked out as I had hoped and the local churches have accepted me as their Local Lay Pastor which has really helped.

Q: How has it changed your feelings about the circuit?

A I've enjoyed being part of the ministerial and leadership team and getting to know those colleagues too.

Q: How long have you offered to do this for?

A: I'm offering 3 years and I offer an average of 6 hours a week. Some weeks it's more hours and some less, but it averages out. I've had holiday too!!

Q: What would you say to anybody wondering about offering as a Local Lay Pastor?

A: If you're thinking of offering this I would say it's well worthwhile and it's helped me to grow and develop.

Quiet Day for ministers, local preachers, and worship leaders

On 21st February we met for our first Quiet Day at the Purley Chase Centre, which provided us with a beautiful setting, delicious food including lunch and lots of cake, and a room with a wonderful view of the gardens to provide inspiration as we went through the day.


We focused on the Feeding of the Five Thousand in Mark 6:30-44. First of all, we considered the context of Jesus and the disciples trying to take some time out for reflection on what had been happening, and we read Wendell Berry’s poem about Sabbath, asking which places brought us peace and how we take Sabbath time for our own spiritual growth.

Next, we looked at how Jesus and the disciples were met by a large crowd, and we reflected on the needs we think we should meet. We reminded ourselves that in Mark 1:29-39 Jesus did not meet all the needs because he had a sense of a larger mission, and we asked ourselves what our personal mission is, and how we best follow our calling.

After lunch we looked at the disciples telling Jesus it was late and he should send the people away to find something to eat. We used colour to help us reflect on issues we face, putting God at the centre of them, and the photograph shows some of the completed pictures and the end of a dried-up branch of blackberries that spoke to one of our number of dying and new life. We shared thoughts on what we had drawn, and as we considered the end of the story, that all ate and were satisfied, we saw that we need to consider our own spiritual feeding in order to be ready to feed others.

I hope that such days can be part of our annual programme of preachers’ and worship leaders’ meetings and training, so that we can draw closer to God and to each other, and build up a team spirit among us, which can only enhance the worshipping life of the Circuit.



Keresley Pit Stop

Our place in Keresley!

Did you know the circuit has helped to begin and fund some new work in Keresley? Here is a history of 'The Keresley Pit Stop'

Please keep the local Christians there in your prayers, call in if you are nearby, and look out for news of a circuit visit to meet them later in the Summer.

History

In 1925 a redundant wooden Sinker's Hut was given to be used as a home for the Mission Church of the Parish of Keresley with Coundon, in Bennett's Road. It was renamed The Church of the Ascension in the 1980s and that building was demolished in December 1994, after it became unsafe, not long before Keresley Colliery finally closed in 1996. After the closure, the small congregation had no new premises, but rose to the challenge, and held services in people's homes, on the village green, in the community hut and in the back room of a pub! It was a test of endurance and faith to continue. Out of this time of fellowship, grew a desire that a new church would be an ecumenical church, and in 1997 two shops in the heart of the village were purchased with money contributed by individuals and other churches, and these shops were converted into Keresley Village Community Church dedicated in February 1999.

In 2016 we set up a community conversation with a questionnaire and meetings to see what people living in the village most wanted. Out of this came a clear need for a meeting place. Community Coffee Stop, a weekly drop-in and café, was the first result. In 2017 the congregation that had been meeting in the church on Sunday mornings as part of an Anglican/Methodist LEP had reduced to a small group of older members and they decided to stop the Sunday services, with remaining members joining with St Thomas. The building was maintained as a community base in the village with the church continuing with various ministries there. The word church was a stumbling block for some and after consultation it was agreed to rename the building 'The Pit Stop.' This reflected the history of the village as a former colliery village and also as a place to stop, be refreshed, take a break and refuel.

Nuneaton Anniversay 2026

Nuneaton MC celebrated our 60th anniversary. Old friends met up, new friends learned about 'old times', the exhibition attracted a lot of interest from local people and those who use the building, helping newer members to 'see' the past of the church.

Over 80 people came to the anniversary meal and on Sunday we were pleased to welcome the district chair, Rev Novette Headley as we celebrated together. An architect is currently conducting a feasibility study and an environmental survey (thanks to funding from the Connexion and the Circuit) to see how we might develop the building with disabled access and lower energy bills, and to discover what the costings will be. We have been very encouraged by a recent legacy gift of £25,000 from a member of the public and by the level of 'pledges' from local people and members. Thank you for keeping us in your prayers as we explore what our future might be and how we can serve the people of Nuneaton in the town centre. Here is another meat-free recipe for you to try from Christine Welham:

Cottage Pie

Ingredients

250g green lentils
50g red lentils
2 sticks of celery
3 carrots
2 or 3 onions
Herbs (thyme, basil,; mixed herbs); bay leaves
1 red pepper
3 tablespoons concentrated tomato purée
1 teaspoon marmite/yeast extract
1 stock cube
oil
2kg potatoes
milk
100 g grated cheese



Directions

1. Rinse and cook the green lentils in water according to the packet instructions. After 20 minutes add the red lentils and more water.
2. Sauté the onions in oil.
3. Chop carrots and add to onions, followed by celery and red pepper.
4. Combine the lentil and vegetables. Add tomato puree, yeast extract, a stock cube and pepper to taste. (You should not need additional salt.)
5. Peel, chop and boil the potatoes. Mash with a little milk.
6. Put the filling into an oven proof dish. Top with the mashed potato and sprinkle the cheese on top. Bake for 25 to 30 minutes at 180°C/160°C fan until the pie is piping hot and crisp on top.

Notes

Lentils: green lentils especially puy/lentilles vertes hold their shape. Red lentils are a source of iron so I recommend including some.

Bay leaves if you have them add flavour and a pleasant aroma. Remove them before adding the potato.

Serving suggestion: a green vegetable and sweet potatoes (sliced and placed on an oiled baking tray), and vegetarian gravy.


