My name is Ade Johnson, and I am the Development Manager at Coventry Methodist Central Hall. I have worked here for four years in different roles, including Events and Bookings Coordinator and City of Culture Project Manager, and I have been Development Manager for the last two years.

Our work has changed and grown, always aiming to make our community more sustainable. This experience has deepened my understanding of community development and inspired me to explore how faith, urban mission, and sustainability connect.

I am now starting a five-year, part-time Doctor of Practical Theology at the University of Roehampton in London. My research will look at the role of Methodist Central Halls as community hubs and how they help build strong, sustainable neighbourhoods. Autumn Recipes

We share another meat-free recipe for you to try: COURGETTE MOUSSAKA

750 gm courgettes, or thereabouts, thinly sliced and halved
Oil to fry

1 large onion, peeled and diced 1 pepper, trimmed, seeded and diced 1 garlic clove, peeled and crushed or 1 tsp garlic

> paste 1 tin tomatoes

1 tbsp tomato puree

1 tbsp chopped fresh mint

100g of sliced gruyere or cheddar cheese, (or 4 squares of presliced cheddar)

2 tbsp plain flour

300ml natural yoghurt

2 egg yolks....use the whites to make a pavlova, coconut pyramids or fruit fool 75 g cheddar cheese grated

Fry the courgettes in the oil until turning soft and

brown, Set aside

Fry the onion, pepper and garlic in the same pan for about 4 minutes. Add more oil as necessary. Add tomatoes, mint, puree, and cook for 2 more minutes.

Layer half the courgettes in an oven proof dish, cover with half tomato mix, then with the sliced cheese. Top this with the tomato mix and finally the reminder of the courgettes.

At this point the dish can be stored, covered) in the fridge for up to 24 hours until ready to proceed.

Mix together the flour, yoghurt, egg yolks until smooth, add the grated cheese. Spoon over the courgettes.

Bake at 200 degrees C for about 40 minutes, until the top is brown.

Serve with vegetables or pasta.

COURGETTE LASAGNE

Make the lasagne your own way but use about three courgettes, sliced and diced, instead of the meat.

"We frequently use Oasis foam for our church

"We frequently use Oasis foam for our church flower arrangements. Peter has sourced a product called 'Oasis Bio' floral foam which is the first available of its kind and has enhanced biodegradability and is sustainable. It is 51.5% biodegradable within 365 days and up to 91% biodegradable within 1,100 days in a biological active landfill. The downside is, as you would expect, it is 25% more expensive, but it is all about making the right choices as we know!"
