The great washable 'Dishcloth Knit'

Calling all knitters!

As part of the circuit's eco-church commitment, we're hoping to have a big dishcloth giveaway... to help people move to using recycled and washable dishcloths. No more one-use bought cloths with plastic materials.

The wool below is recycled cotton and we've given each church a couple of balls to get started. You could take donations towards the next balls of wool, as a way of keeping the project going.

Pattern: actually any square you like!

This is a diamond shape:

Using 5 mm needles, cast on 5 stitches, increase one at the beginning of next two rows, till 7 stitches. Then to increase: Knit 3, put wool round over to the front, knit to

the end

Repeat until it's as big as you'd like (I used 10 – 15 rows) Then to decrease:

Knit 2, knit 2 together, pull wool round over to the front, knit 2 together, knit to the end.

When 7 stitches are left, knit 2 stitches together at the end of the next 2 rows. Then cast off the last 5 stitches.

Sew in the ends. Approx 2 dishcloths per ball
